VIRGINIA TECH SPORTS HALL OF FAME

The Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame was established in 1982 to honor and preserve the memory of athletes, coaches, administrators and staff members who have made outstanding contributions to athletics at the university. A total 157 individuals have been inducted into the Tech Hall of Fame during special ceremonies held each fall. Some of the following were inducted for other sports, but all have ties to Virginia Tech wrestling.



MILTON ANDES
(inducted in 1994)

A 125-pound wrestling champion of the 1920s who went on to fame as a National AAU champion.



BRANDON GLOVER
(inducted in 1988)

An All-America wrestler, he was a four-time SoCon champion who lost only one match in his career.



FRANK TESKE
(inducted in 1995)

He led Tech to seven Southern Conference wrestling championships in a 23-year coaching stint.



SHERMAN VANDEVENDER
(inducted in 2001)

A four-time SoCon wrestling champion who advanced to the final Olympic tryouts in 1956.



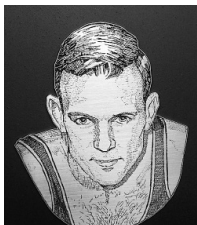
GENE BREEN
